

A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

There is something strangely mysterious and romantic surrounding the story of Bonnie Parker and Clyde Barrow. There's an air of allure and magic wrapped up in these two star crossed lovers. The first, for me, in being how young they were when they were killed in the fateful shoot-out in Louisiana in 1934. Clyde was 25 and Bonnie only 23. What happened that caused them to turn to a life of crime, albeit a short one? Part of the answer can be found in history, during the Great Depression. This was one of America's worst periods for the working class in our recent history. Most people were without jobs and couldn't find work. The time was dreary, desolate, grey, and hopeless. It was truly a depression in all sense of the word. Then, out of nowhere, came these two, vibrant criminals. They captivated the American public. The media sensationalized these two individuals and added more mystery to their story. Many citizens agreed with their actions - rob the rich banks and putting on a show -- and, of course, many disagreed with them, feeling that they should be treated as the criminals they were.

We don't know what caused these two children to live the life they led. All we can do is speculate. And you, as an audience member, get to look at it with fresh eyes and make your own opinion about Bonnie and Clyde. Were they heroes of the Great Depression? Or were they criminals? The answer is in the story.

Thanks for coming. Please tell your friends. I hope you enjoy Bonnie and Clyde as much as I have, and I will see you in the lobby after the show.




