DIRECTORS NOTES

Guys and Dolls, with music and lyrics by Frank Loesser and book by Jo Swerling and Abe Burrows is based on "The Idyll of Miss Sarah Brown" and "Blood Pressure", which are two short stories by Damon Runyon, and also borrows characters and plot elements from other Runyon stories, such as "Pick the Winner". These stories, written in the 1920s and 1930s, concerned gangsters, gamblers, and other characters of the New York underworld. Runyon was known for the unique dialect he employed in his stories, mixing highly formal language and slang.

The show premiered on Broadway in 1950, where it ran for 1,200 performances and won the Tony Award for Best Musical in 1951. It has been revived many times on Broadway and London. A little-known fact, Laurence Olivier had wanted to play Nathan Detroit, and began rehearsals for a planned 1971 London revival for the National Theatre Company, then based at the Old Vic. However, due to poor health he had to stop, and his revival never happened.

I am pleased to present this production to you as we begin our 75th season. We have been in rehearsal since the end of January, through snow, sleet and ice filled streets. But through it all, this talented cast worked tirelessly to create an enjoyable theatrical experience. So, sit back and relax as Runyon's characters come to life. And, enjoy Guys and Dolls.



Abe Burrows

Libretto

After studying to be a doctor and an accountant, Abe Burrows had a career in sales before becoming a successful radio script writer and writer/performer of musical parody numbers. His first Broadway libretto was Guys and Dolls, co-written with Jo Swerling, with a score by Frank Loesser. Among the musicals for which he provided librettos are Make A Wish, Can-Can and Silk Stockings (both with scores by Cole Porter), Say, Darling, and How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying (which he also directed; score by Frank Loesser). His non-musical plays include Cactus Flower (wrote and directed) and Forty Carats (directed).



Jo Swerling

Libretto

Born in Russia in 1897, Jo Swerling was a playwright, screenwriter and vaudeville sketch writer. Mr. Swerling's long career began as a reporter and feature writer in New York and Chicago.



Frank Loesser

Music and Lyrics

One of America's great composer/lyricists, Frank Loesser began his songwriting career during the Depression as a lyricist, contributing songs to Broadway revues and nightclub acts. His work with composer Irving Actman in the 1936 revue THE ILLUSTRATOR'S SHOW led to a songwriting contract in Hollywood, where he spent the next eleven years working with such composers as Burton Lane, Jule Styne, Arthur Schwartz and Hoagy Carmichael.

Some of his film songs from that period include "Two Sleepy People," "Jingle Jangle Jingle" and "I Don't Want To Walk Without You." The first song for which Loesser wrote both words and music was "Praise The Lord And Pass The Ammunition," written during his World War II service. His Hollywood work after the war included the hit songs "Spring Will Be A Little Late This Year," "A Slow Boat To China," and the 1949 Oscarwinning song "Baby, It's Cold Outside."

In 1948 Loesser was approached by fledgling Broadway producers Cy Feuer and Ernest

Martin to write music and lyrics to George Abbott's libretto for an adaptation of the classic Brandon Thomas play Charley's Aunt. The new musical, which starred Ray Bolger, was called **WHERE'S CHARLEY?** and was a hit. This led to Loesser's next show, the hugely influential and successful **GUYS AND DOLLS** in 1950, also produced by Feuer and Martin, with a script by Abe Burrows and Jo Swerling. In 1956 Loesser wrote the libretto, music and lyrics for his next show, **THE MOST HAPPY FELLA**, adapted from Sidney Howard's play, They Knew What They Wanted. This impressive score contains over 30 musical numbers and makes extensive use of operatic techniques and forms, including recitative, arias, duets, trios and choral numbers. In 1960 he provided the score and was co-librettist for **GREENWILLOW**. In 1961, Loesser wrote the score for the Pulitzer Prize-winning **HOW TO SUCCEED IN BUSINESS WITHOUT REALLY TRYING**. A NOTE FROM T&C'S PRESIDENT

Welcome to the Town and Country Players' 2022 Season. This represents a milestone year in our history, as this is our 75th season of bringing quality community theater to the Bucks County Area.

Town and Country Players got its start in 1948, with a production of *The Late George Apley*, performed at the Doylestown Borough School. T&C moved to our current location, "The Barn," in 1953, renting the barn until we purchased it in 1962. Throughout the years, we have made many improvements to our space, including air conditioning, catwalks, raked seating, sound and lighting improvements, and - perhaps most importantly - our addition in 2014 which tripled the number of restrooms and added rehearsal space.

That said, T&C is more than just the name and the barn that we perform in. If one looks at our database of past productions, one will find a list of nearly 4000 individuals who have been involved in our productions over the years, from actors, musicians, directors, and producers, to designers, technicians, carpenters, stage crew, and stage managers. This doesn't include those members who have supported us in other areas, including the myriad of business/operational areas required to continuously bring productions to the stage.

Of course, all the effort required to bring a production to the stage, wouldn't count for much without the support of our community. From the 400 patrons who came to see *The Late George Apley* in 1948 to the 150 who can fill the house for each performance in our intimate theater today, without our patrons, all those hours and late nights spent rehearsing, designing, building would be for naught.

I also want to thank all those who have donated to T&C over the years. Your generosity has enabled us to keep the lights on, improve our infrastructure, and weather hard times (like the last couple of years).

When we started to plan our 75th season, we decided to focus on large cast, generally happy/ uplifting shows after two seasons impacted by COVID. We also wanted to celebrate our 75th season by selecting shows with either a tie to either T&C or to the Bucks County area. Tony Award winning *Guys and Dolls*, described as a "the perfect musical comedy," was first produced by T&C in 2000. This year's production, directed by Sheldon Bruce Zeff, brings together a new cast and a new vision for the show. Whether you have seen our 2000 production or not, I hope you enjoy this one.



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





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
