A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Act Three of Chekhov's brilliant drama, The Three Sisters, ends with two of the sisters, Irina and Olga, deciding to move to Moscow. Says Irina, "My dear, darling sister, I esteem, I highly value the Baron, he's a splendid man; I'll marry him, I'll consent, only let's go to Moscow! I implore you, let's go! There's nothing better than Moscow on earth. Let's go, Olga, let's go!"

I'm not sure Moscow is, as they say, all that, but going to a place where you'll be comfortable, where you can sit back, stretch out, and call your surroundings home is a goal we all share. Vanya and Sonia and Masha and Spike explores that very theme — home, family, and a shared identity. As Vanya tells his family in the second act, "There are no shared memories anymore. Now there's Twitter and email and Facebook and cable and satellite, and the movies and TV shows are all worthless, and we don't even watch the same worthless things together, it's all separate. And our lives are...disconnected." Vanya desperately wants connectedness again. He wants what we all want: to belong, to share our experiences with someone we love, and to engage in a larger, more important world.

One might argue, of course, that modern communication actually fosters connection, allowing us to engage with far more people in much less time than ever before, but that would be missing the weightier point. Direct, inperson contact is critical to our very being, and no number of Facebook friends or Twitter followers will ever change that.

And where better to engage with our fellow humans than right here in bucolic, resplendent, utterly charming Bucks County? From the northern reaches of Riegelsville to the southern edges of Bristol and Tullytown, Bucks County offers a home for city-, suburb-, and country-dwellers alike. As for me, I love Doylestown and the central Bucks area. I feel at home here, comfortable, and content. Whenever I travel, wherever I go, there always comes a time when I can't wait to go home, when I say to my beautiful wife, "Oh, my dear, darling Gay, let's go to Bucks County. To Bucks County let us go!"

The cast and crew of any show create a sisterhood and brotherhood backstage and onstage, one that presents to an audience a final product bore from weeks of work and dedication. Please enjoy the fruits of this family of siblings as much as we have enjoyed creating the bonds that surround them.

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
